**Co-development of a cooperative role-playing game
on knowledge-sharing of agroforestry practices
(in Paris, France)**

Co-developed a participatory role-playing game to collect and share data on local knowledge and practices related to agrobiodiversity management in Madagascar, aiming to understand how farmers adapt their agricultural practices and strategies in response to environmental, economic, and demographic changes.
